

# Heathfield Academy PE and Sports Premium Funding: Impact Report 2016/2017

## Objectives of PE and Sports Premium Spending

- The government has provided £150 million per year for the academic years 2013 / 2014, 2014 / 2015, 2015 / 2016 and 2016/2017 to increase funding for school sports. The funding has been jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport.
- The money goes directly to Headteachers to enable them to improve the quality of PE and sport for all children but schools can choose how to spend it.

## How is PE and Sports Premium Funded?

- Each school receives £8,000 plus £5 per pupil in years 1 to 6.
- At Heathfield Academy we will receive £8185 in 2016/17.
- Funding will be received in 2 instalments (February and May)

To transport the Reception children to swimming over 7 weeks. (Autumn 1)	To give children an opportunity to experience swimming for the first time and to embed healthy life choices at an early age.	£720 All Reception children attended swimming lessons for 6 weeks.
Swimming lessons for all Reception children	To give children an opportunity to experience swimming for the first time and to embed healthy life choices at an early age.	£174.30 The Reception children developed confidence and resilience during the course of the lessons. Especially children who had never been in a swimming pool before. All children were able to lift their feet and kick with a float and put their faces in

		the water. Some families have continued to take their children swimming when they hadn't done so before.
Purchase of additional sports equipment for use at lunchtime in Reception and Year 1	To ensure all children are making healthy choices at playtimes and are actively engaged in sports activities	£500 The range of activities on offer to the children increased and the new equipment was used well to develop the children's turn taking and sharing. The children are a lot more active during break times.
Purchase of additional sports equipment for use during PE sessions in Reception and Year 1	To improve the quality of resources used in PE sessions and provide children with a variety of sports	£1000 New equipment was purchased and used to provide a range of quality activities. Equipment for team games has had a particular impact with the children playing cooperatively and showing good sportsmanship.
To provide training for key members of staff in teaching PE in EYFS and KSI	To improve the quality of PE taught across the school	£200 A key member of staff is booked onto a developing Physical Education course in the Autumn term in order to improve subject knowledge and disseminate information to staff.
Staff meeting time to disseminate good practice of teaching PE across the school	To improve the quality of PE taught across the school	£50 Regular meetings between the PE leads in the school and class teachers ensure progress is tracked and lessons are planned according to the children's abilities and needs.
Purchase of trim trails for EYFS and KSI	Trim trails are purchased and installed in EYFS and Y1 playgrounds ensuring children are actively engaged in healthy activities during play and lunchtimes.	£5000 Trim trails have been sourced and a date set for installation towards the end of the Autumn term. Trails for the reception, Year 1 and Year 2 playgrounds.
Attendance at PE leaders meetings and training	To develop the knowledge of key members of staff across the school	£300 A key member of staff is responsible for leading PE across Year 2 and Reception.
